- A. Comparative study of the single and the two-stage cross-face nerve graft with free muscle transfer for the treatment of facial paralysis.
- B. Anatomical study to find a suitable donor muscle that can be anatomically split into 2 functional units with 2 separate nerve pedicles to enable us to restore both elevator and depressor functions of upper and lower lips respectively. Three muscles namely, gracilis, latissimus dorsi and serratus anterior obtained from fresh cadavers were subjected to dye injection and x ray and photos.
